PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

EXCEL program is powered by Malaysia Anti-Corruption Academy (MACA) to assist organisations to develop an Organization Anti-Corruption Plan (“OACP”) to reduce the impact of corruption. The provision under Section 17A of the MACC Act 2009 prescribes the principle of corporate liability whereby a commercial organisation is guilty of an offense if any of its employees and/or associates commit corruption for the benefit of the organisation. Any commercial organisation, together with its “director, controller, officer or partner”; or persons who are “concerned in the management of its affairs”, may be prosecuted if its employees and/or any persons associated with the organisation carry out corrupt practices for the benefit or advantage of the organisation. The need for organisations to establish an adequate procedure through an OACP is crucial to protect the organisation against corruption risk. If a commercial organisation is convicted of an offense, the punishment under Section 17A (2) is a fine of not less than 10 times the value of the bribe or RM1 million, whichever is higher, or imprisonment for up to 20 years, or both.
